



Spring in the Valley 2021 EXPERIENCE

Using current government guidelines and guidance from industry professionals, including one of Specially Gifted Foundation's co-founders who is a Registered Nurse, Spring in the Valley plans to implement a number of enhanced health and safety measures at the event that will allow attendees to have a safe and enjoyable experience.

This mostly-outdoors event will incorporate enhanced safety measures including but not limited to: physical distancing in all areas, increased cleaning procedures, the use of appropriate face coverings by guests and staff, separate and limited-contact entry/exit points, and additional safety training for all event staff and personnel.

Attendees and personnel will be required to follow strict at-event safety measures that will be disclosed to them prior to purchasing tickets for the event. Attendees will be required to agree to these safety measures before entering, wear face masks, and physically distance throughout the event.

A professional team will be in place to engage with guests and promote mask use and physical distancing guidelines throughout the event space.

FACE COVERINGS

- All attendees will be required to wear face masks upon entry, when moving around the event space, and when physical distancing is not possible
- Face masks will be available for those without one of their own
- Face coverings worn by event staff and personnel at all times, required



PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- Six feet physical distanced queuing area for entry into event grounds
- Enlarged common areas and walkways
- One-way and other directional signage will be installed to assist attendees to responsibly move throughout the property

ENHANCED STAFF

- Professional crowd control team to engage with guests and promote physical distancing in all areas of the event grounds throughout the event
- Our cleaning and disinfecting team will be cleaning shared surfaces and common areas during the event

SIGNAGE

- Signage placed at highly visible locations that promote physical distancing, protective measures, and how to stop the spread- throughout the event grounds, parking lots, common areas, and entry/exits
- One way and directional signage to direct traffic

HAND WASHING and SANITIZATION

- Hand sanitizing stations will be available at a variety of locations throughout the event grounds
- Hand washing signs and stations will be in all restrooms throughout the event

FOOD TRUCKS, COMMON AREAS, RESTROOMS

- Food Trucks will be open and following all COVID-19 safety guidelines
 - Workers are required to wash or sanitize their hands upon entering the establishment and between interactions with attendees
 - Use rolled silverware and covered straws
- All common areas will be large enough to allow for physical distancing
- Multiple restroom areas
- Cashless payment options will be available for all transactions at the event



MODIFIED ENTRY AND EXIT PROCEDURES

- Specific entry and exit points laid out with physical barriers and ground markings- lanes will be large enough to allow for physical distancing during the entry and exit process
- Contactless temperature checks will be performed at each entry lane

EDUCATION

- Comprehensive written education and guidelines will be provided to all staff and attendees to ensure that everyone in attendance at the event is on the same page

MISCELLANEOUS

- This event is working with Viral Protective Services' Eventsafe, a company that offers a comprehensive and holistic approach to infection prevention in the trade show and event industry, to ensure all appropriate safety measures will be taken
- Broadcasted announcement promoting protective measures and how to stop the spread- there will be announcements on the audio system reminding attendees and staff of guidelines set in place
- Touchless entry process- all tickets and parking passes will be emailed to ticket purchasers, tickets will be scanned on attendee's mobile devices, allowing a touchless entry for all attendees.
- Attendees and staff educated to stay home if they are experiencing any symptoms or have been potentially exposed to COVID-19 (symptoms may include a fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea)- this education will be included with all event listings leading up to the event, as well as on-site signage at entry points
- All policies and procedures are in place with current and up to date CDC recommendations, and will be continually updated to stay within updated guidelines
